Trenton Man Arrested in Connection to Suspicious Death Investigation

A Trenton man has been arrested and charged in connection to the recent death of Corrine Daniels, Mercer County Prosecutor Angelo J. Onofri reported.

Alton Eubanks, 48, of Trenton, is charged with purposefully disturbing, moving and/or concealing human remains. He was arrested on October 12, 2002, in Middleburg, NY, by members of the U.S. Marshals NY/NJ Regional Fugitive Task Force. The prosecutor's office has filed a motion to detain Eubanks pending trial.

The charge is the result of an investigation by the Mercer County Homicide Task Force and the Trenton Police Department. On September 21, 2022, Trenton Communications received a call for a well-being check at a residence on Park Avenue. Responding officers forced entry and located the body of a deceased individual in the basement. On September 22, an autopsy was conducted by the Middlesex County Medical Examiner's Office. The victim was identified as Corrine Daniels, 41, of Park Avenue in Trenton. The cause and manner of Ms. Daniels death are pending as the medical examiner's office awaits the results of additional testing.

Investigation into Ms. Daniels' suspicious death thus far has revealed that she and Eubanks lived together at the Park Avenue address as boyfriend and girlfriend. After Ms. Daniels death, Eubanks placed her body in a black trash bag and moved her to the basement where she was located by officers.

Despite having been charged, every defendant is presumed innocent until found guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.
